A letter to the editor

Thanks to our regular correspondent and former Tad resident, John Childs, who has written from his exile in Scarborough with memories of our beach...

Tadcaster Sands.

When I used to visit my maternal grandmother at Rose Cottage, Wharfe Banks on a Friday evening after school, I would often go down to the 'sands' and build sand castles. I would be about eight years old, it was during the second world war in 1942.

At that time few people would go to the coast because of the war, most men were in the forces, and, the difficulty of getting there, so at this time the 'sands' at Tadcaster was very popular to many children, some paddling and others attempting to swim. In Victorian times nearly all Tadcaster children played on the 'sands' and others from as far away as Leeds.

In amongst the sand were broken mussel shells, not fresh water ones, but ones similar to those found on the beach at Scarborough. Are there still mussels living in the River Wharfe at Tadcaster?

Brayshaws, stonemasons and builders used to dredge sand from the river, near the bridge,

I don't suppose many children visit the 'sands' nowadays, because of the floods, and also because in this day and age, computers occupy most children!

Albion go again!

Tadcaster Albion have kicked off their second season in the Evo-Stik Division One North, the eighth tier of the English Football Pyramid with a new duo in charge and plenty of new faces on the pitch.

Michael Morton and Simon Collins were appointed as the new management team of Tadcaster Albion in May 2017 after the directors decided to bring the job in-house with the duo already running the i2i Football Academy.

They didn't waste any time in making changes as no fewer than eleven new faces were brought to the club, most with experience of playing at a much higher level. The Brewers began the season on the road at Ramsbottom United and left Bury empty-handed after a stunning late free-kick won the game for the home side.

It wasn't the best of games or the best of surfaces for that matter but nevertheless it was an emphatic response in the first home

game on the following Tuesday as Taddy thumped Ossett Albion 7-1.

And yes, it was as dominant as a performance as the score line suggests, it could have been even more.

On Saturday the 19th August, Albion were unfortunately knocked out of the Emirates FA Cup after narrowly losing 1-0 to Colne at the i2i Stadium.

Going from a goal frenzy to goal shy in the space of four days, but that's football.

The Partnership Board is made up of District, County, Town, and Parish Councillors, and co-opted members of the community.

What is the Community Fund?

The CEF receives an annual budget that it can distribute to groups and organisations within the area. There are two types of funding available; grant funding and project funding.

We successfully called on volunteers and deployed the pump during a busy working day. We would like to thank all our volunteers for their continued support.

As a group, we continue to have meetings and update businesses and residents with the Agency's progress. On the 6th of August we held a successful "drop in" session for the residents and businesses to meet the Agencies, for updates and to increase resilience. We have good news that the Environment Agency are working in the background for a scheme for Tadcaster's flood defenses which we hope the options can be delivered to the public soon, watch this space!

Most importantly, join us at our next family event on Sunday 15th of October 11am to 3pm at the Riley Smith Hall. Promoting good well-being and how risks can be

reduced in homes, businesses and living within the community. The Flood Advice Fair in October 2016 was very successful and we are expanding the target audience for 2017. The children of St Joseph's School have always had an eye on helping others and have now formally signed up to become a "Mini Vinnies" school.

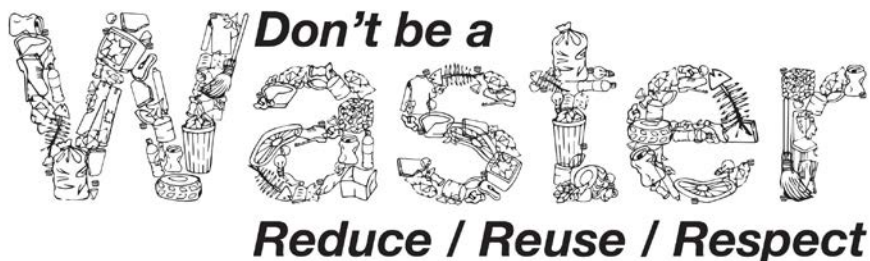

Bus Passes

North Yorkshire County Council administer applications for Senior person's and Disabled person's bus passes.

For a senior person's bus pass you need to be the current women's pension age. You can check your eligibility online at <https://www.northyorks.gov.uk/senior-persons-bus-pass>.

Before applying online, please ensure you have the following to hand otherwise you will not be able to apply online:

- a digital passport quality photo to upload to your application;
- a valid email address; and
- your passport or driving licence.

Volunteers at Tadcaster Community Library can help you access this information, using the public network computers, and start your application online. However, the previous



service offered by the library to do a full bus pass application is no longer available. For a disabled person's bus pass you can find out more information about eligibility and download a form at <https://www.northyorks.gov.uk/disabled-persons-bus-pass>. The library volunteers can also help you with this.

Tadcaster Community Library – Our First Six Months

In April 2017 an expanded group of volunteers took over the aptly renamed Tadcaster Community Library. We started with a group of 25 volunteers and have since recruited and trained a further 9 volunteers. This has meant that we have been able to maintain the opening hours.

While the first few months were a steep learning curve, even for the original volunteers, most have now got to grips with the increased workload the volunteers have taken over. We have also had a great deal of support from North Yorkshire Library Services, particularly Julie Lakin and Alison Tutill, for which we are very grateful. In recent weeks volunteers have been encouraging children to take part in the Summer Reading Challenge, which has seen a great take-up in Tadcaster. Now that we are established we are looking to the future and will be working with individuals or organisations who can



help us further develop our volunteers, strengthen the management committee, work with other organisations in the area and publicise the activities and services the library provides. We have received very generous funding grants from both Tadcaster Town Council and the Tadcaster and Villages CEF, which will go towards funding this work. We have also received a grant from Church Fenton Parish Council which will go towards our running costs.

The library will be holding an Open Day on Saturday 7 October, where you will be able to find out more about how we've got on, talk to volunteers and take part in activities.

Tadcaster Cemetery - Memorial Safety Inspection

Tadcaster Town Council carried out a memorial safety inspection in June to ensure that our cemetery is a safe place for all those who work in and visit it.

A number of headstones and memorials have been marked as being in a potentially dangerous condition with a notice posted on or near the memorial. Some other larger memorials have been carefully laid flat within the grave space. Please do not touch or approach these marked memorials.

For these unsafe or unauthorised memorials, the Council will make every effort to contact the registered grave owner outlining the case circumstances, if after six months it does not receive a reply the Council will consider the action in respect of those memorials.

Why are we informing owners of memorials? The owner of a memorial is the Deed Holder (grave owner of exclusive right of burial). This person is responsible for maintaining



the memorial so that it does not become a hazard. However, in some cases, the current owner may not be identifiable as some records are extremely old and might not have been updated by current relatives or family members.

Full details of the inspection are available from the Council. Any concerns or questions about the memorial assessment process should be referred to Tadcaster Town Council (contact details on page 7).

Five questions with... Chris Porter – Tadcaster Swimming Pool Trust

What's your name and job title, what does that entail?

Chris Porter – Facility Manager
My job entails a variety of skills and roles. As a small team I can find myself delivering Swimming Lessons, Lifeguarding and helping with maintenance jobs.
The other part of my role involves managing the team, setting budgets, monitoring the accounts and all aspects of Health and Safety.

Tell us something about the pool that people don't know?

The Swimming Pool is a registered Charity and receives no ongoing funding to pay for the running of the facility. The admission charges are essential to keep the Charity in operation as well as maintaining and reinvesting in the equipment and facilities.

The Charity has a small number of paid staff who are supported by volunteers, who complete a variety of roles.

How many people learn to swim there?

We teach 1100 pupils per week in our Learn to Swim Programme, we also have a waiting list of 1000 pupils waiting to start lessons (we could do with another Swimming Pool)!!!
We also deliver School Swimming to 7 schools and have a hugely successful



Swim Squad with 100 swimmers. We average about 3500 attendances per week for Swimming.

How many volunteers work at the pool?

Around 130 in a variety of roles, including Trustees, Receptionists, Lifeguards, Maintenance, Website Designers and many more.

What's the best thing about your job?

The best thing about my job is the variety and how busy the role and facility are. I also enjoy getting involved in events like the Tadcaster Triathlon and the Duck Race.

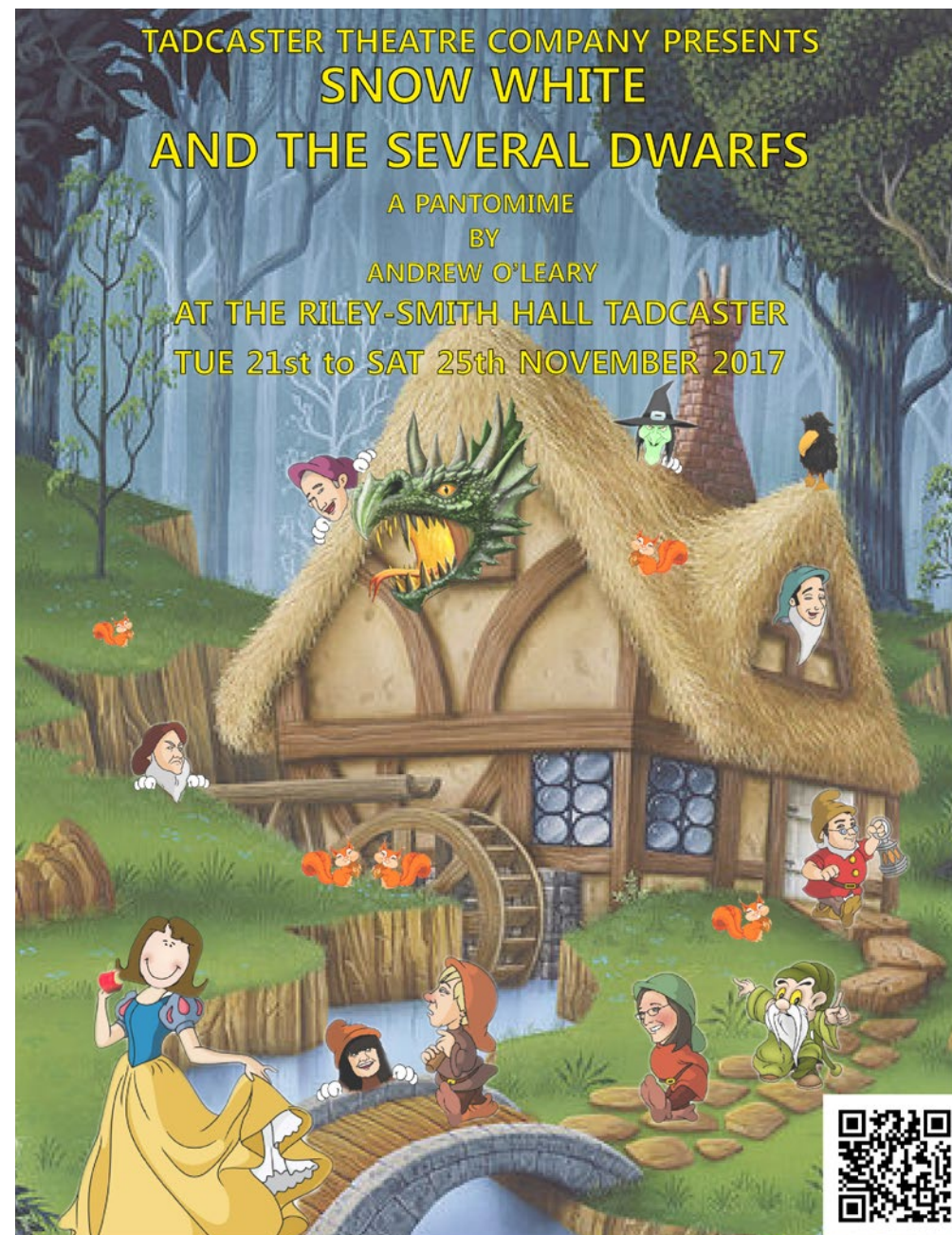

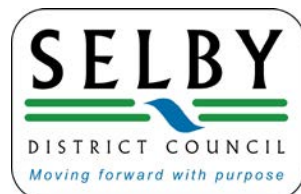

Cesca's winning design

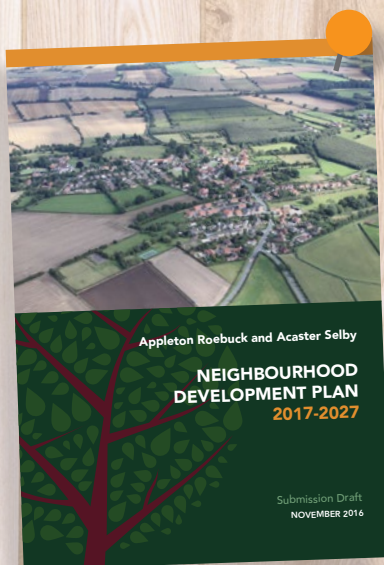

Focus on..Neighbourhood Planning and your Community Rights

IN 2011, the government introduced the Localism Act which gave communities a range of new rights, including the right to produce their own "chapter" of the District Council's Local Plan. This is known as Neighbourhood Development Planning and over 2000 communities nationally have prepared or are preparing their Plans – including Appleton Roebuck and Acaster Selby, who's Plan has recently been examined by a Planning Inspector and will soon be voted on in a referendum by parishioners. Also hard at work on their Plans are Ulleskelf and Church Fenton Parish Councils.
